They came back to the valley in the summer of 1949 after having a baby girl in July and moved to Elsa. In 1954 they moved to McAllen with their two daughters, Jan and Pat and then had two more girls, Sue and Lyn.

Bob then started an independent insurance company in Pharr Texas and stayed there until he retired. He passed away on July 21, 2006.
