His parents were Weslaco natives and entrepreneurs. They ran one of the first barber shops in Weslaco. He had two brothers, Javier and Jose Angel. Arturo would spend most of his life in Weslaco. He went to Catholic school as a young boy and graduated from Weslaco High and attended college at Pan American. Arturo met his future wife and soulmate, Juanita, in junior high. Shortly after graduation, they were married, in 1969 in their aunt's backyard. They enjoyed forty-eight years of marriage and raised a beautiful family together. Arturo and Juanita spent their first summer of marriage in Michigan, where they would get married in the Catholic Church and Arturo was trying to decide how he would raise his family. They soon returned to Weslaco where Arturo would begin his career at Central Plumbing and Electric as a salesman.
